

Due to the ongoing situation in the Middle East, we have made further changes to our flying schedule to provide greater clarity for our customers.

We have extended the temporary reduction in our flying schedule in the region.

We are reducing our Dubai, Doha and Tel Aviv flights to one daily flight each, which are scheduled to resume on 01 July. Our service to Riyadh is scheduled to resume from mid-May. While our flights to Bahrain and Amman are paused until the end of the summer season and scheduled to resume on 25 October. Following a review of our flying programme, we have taken the difficult decision to permanently suspend services to Jeddah from the 24 April.

We're keeping the situation under constant review and are directly in touch with affected customers to offer them a range of options.

Since the disruption began, with thanks to you, we've helped thousands of customers return home, operated relief flights, and added additional capacity on key long-haul routes. Building on this, from June to October 2026 we are adding capacity across key long-haul routes through larger aircraft and additional frequencies. This includes more seats on Delhi and Hyderabad, extra daily services to Bangalore, Nairobi* and Mumbai, and increased frequencies to Delhi during peak summer.

We will continue to assess and introduce further flying where possible.

Safety remains our absolute priority, and we will only operate flights where it is safe to do so.
